<p>120/17 Apologies Cllr Brereton sent apologies but they were not received until after the meeting had taken place (adverse weather and work commitments).</p>	
<p>121/17 Minutes of Last Meeting It was resolved that the Chair be authorised to sign the minutes of the Parish Council meeting held on <u>Monday 11th September 2017</u> as a true record.</p>

<p>124/17 Public Participation</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • PCSO Harris - Police report <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ 02/09/2017; rough sleeper arrested on suspicion of burglary ○ 24/09/2017; cyclist knocked off bike by a dog ○ 08/10/2017; known poacher in the area • PCSO Harris – Speed Indication Device (SID) report from Sparks Bridge. There was reduced speed of vehicles coming into Sparks Bridge compared to monitoring 2 years ago. However 85% of vehicles logged were on average travelling at 33mph. There is nowhere safe for speed cameras to be sited. A recommendation will be sent to Highways for the use of dragons teeth markings on the road. It will be down to Highways to decide if they think this a viable option. The council will monitor the situation and follow up with highways if there is no progress. A member of the public asked a question about cyclists travelling parallel causing safety issues around Bouth and from Greenodd to Bouth Tollbar. PCSO Harris confirmed they are within the law and added that agricultural vehicles only have to pull over if they are not matching the speed limit. • John Hudson (Kirby Moor wind farm application) – Delivered a personal statement but that reflect the views of others. Concern that communities are having a wind farm imposed upon them. The original planning has come to an end and the land should be returned to a SSSI as detailed in the original planning permission of 1992. Nine of the 10 parish councils whose views have been sought have objected to the planning. 	
<p>125/17 Update on Issues and Actions from Last Meeting</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • ACV for woodlands, Cllr Hoyle informed the council that Stoney Hazel Wood should now be on the register. • Declaration of office; signed by Fiona Baxter and the Clerk. Declaration of interest form given, to be completed and returned directly to SDLC. • It is noted that there is a vacancy for East Ward, which needs to be filled by a resident from the area around Lakeside or Finsthwaite • Bouth Village Green Committee have responded to the annual safety inspection – Kick wall will be repaired at October work party, other items will be monitored through monthly inspections. <p>126/17 Comments from District and County Councillors</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cllr Fletcher – Apologised for his lack of attendance over the last 12 months due to health issues. Closure of common land at New Road to vehicles has led to a review of parking charges in Kendal with some reductions. There has been an audit of the 61 playgrounds in the SLDC area. Funds will be spread more evenly in the future and Cllr Fletcher spoke up on behalf of rural villages for this funding. Waste; roll out of plastic and cardboard recycling to 	

<p>households almost complete. Review of parish council boundaries leading to 3 member wards. Funding; £1k pot for Locally Important Projects (LIP's) and £5k of LDNPA accessible to councils.</p>	
<p>127/17 Rural Crime</p> <p><u>It was resolved to withdraw from certain aspects of the rural crime initiative.</u> Councillors voted by a majority against the use of automatic number plate recognition (ANPR) cameras within the parish. Councillors expressed concern over the policies and procedures required and the legal implications of ownership of supporting the CCTV aspect of the scheme, Reservations were expressed about surveillance, how the CCTV information could be used and the proposed locations of the cameras; it was expressed that the poacher/farm watch element of the scheme could be more strongly supported. A member of the public asked if any letters of concern had been received from the public, reply was none. Also asked what happens if the majority of the community want the cameras and stated that camera use may push criminals out of the area, Cllr Dean replied that as it was the council who would be ultimately responsible it was their decision. Cllr Hoyle listed all the codes of practise that would need to be adhered to. Clerk to inform rural crime group and Satterthwaite PC of outcome.</p>	<p>Clerk</p>
<p>128/17 Highways and Lengthsman</p> <p><u>An update was received from the lengthsman as follows:</u> It has been a busy month with water! Beeches up to Rusland Hall, several drains were blocked. Requested Highways to add culvert. Lots of water run off at Lakeside and Finsthwaite. Tottlebank Farm has a blocked drain, visit scheduled. Coniston East road needs attention but Archie yet to visit. Thwiate Head to Becksides Cottage, drains blocked with mud, resident has reported to Highways via the hotline, drain covers found upside down. Issue with hedge cutting and missing the last few feet. This now needs to be strimmed. There is a collapsed storm drain at Ickenthwaite. Social media is proving a useful way of Archie being notified of issues. Archie requested working in the road signs under H&S, council approved this, Archie to let clerk know costs and order. Cllr Fletcher asked; Does council know when roads were last swept or suckered? No one was sure but not recently. Would be good to coincide CCC works with the lengthsman role. Clerk to investigate. <u>It was noted that there has been a visit from the Environment Agency to Finsthwaite.</u> Report was positive in that flood prevention methods are needed, unsure what this will look like due to budget and logistics. Reassurance that communications will be regular and community kept up to date with progress. Key contact for EA is Sam Townend. <u>It was resolved to defer creating a Highways Priority list</u> until the December meeting.
